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### ISF Student Named as 2002/3 National Merit Scholar

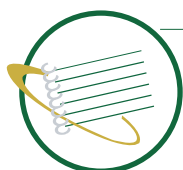

## Future School Openings

### *The International School of Choueifat – Cairo Dreamland – City of 6 October Branch*



The construction of *ISC- Cairo Dreamland – City of 6 October Branch (ISC-Dreamland)*, opening in September of this year, is well underway and on schedule. This new member of the SABIS® School Network will cater to students from KG1 to Grade 8 in its initial year, on a site of 60,000 square meter. At least one grade level will be added each year, until 12<sup>th</sup> grade students are incorporated into the student population.

Following the campus design of its sister school, *ISC-Cairo, ISC-Dreamland* will offer a full range of facilities for the school's first intake of students. Phase I of this new-build project will be handed over in two stages: In May the administration building (home to the business office and the offices for admissions, Student Life and the computer department housing a library on two levels) and two teaching buildings with art and music rooms together with science and computer laboratories, was handed over by the contractors. Soon after that, the Sports Center (with its multi-purpose gym and Olympic-sized swimming pool) and a circular junior swimming pool building will be handed over to the school as will the outdoor sports facilities, playgrounds and a car track for infants.

The outdoor sporting facilities are comprised of a track, a football pitch, two tennis courts, two volleyball courts and a basketball-cum-handball court. By mid-June, the accommodation for the expatriate academic staff will be finished, ready for the arrival of the new teachers in August.

*ISC-Dreamland's* external color, coming from the perimeter trees, grassed areas flower beds and play equipment, will complement the colorfully-painted apartments and villas of our neighbors. The flowering trees along the boundary wall have already been planted and by the time this edition of the SABIS® Newsletter goes to press, the rest of the planting will have been done, making sure that by the time the school opens its doors in September, trees, shrubs and plants will all be fairly well rooted. This greenery will give shade, be restful to the eye, and soften the newness of the campus as well as give welcome splashes of color in this land of searing sun and sand.

The Dreamland area - near the City of 6<sup>th</sup> October - is a rapidly developing community that boasts a golf course, a university and an innovative, modern council. Almost next door to the school is Dreamland Park, a popular and exciting theme park for children of all ages.

Phase II of the project will see three more teaching buildings and an 'auditorium' that will not only house the school theater (which will double as the exam hall) but will also have a spacious and light self-service cafeteria offering hot and cold lunches. Another residence for foreign staff will see the site completed. On completion of the work, *ISC-Dreamland* will be able to educate a student population that exceeds 2,000. When *ISC-Dreamland* is in 'full flight', it is possible that development of a Phase III may be considered on adjacent land.

ISC-Dreamland is set to do everything it can to contribute to and benefit this up and coming community. Its physical properties may not stand the test of time the way one of its other near neighbors - the pyramids of Giza - one of the wonders of the ancient and the modern worlds - has done, but it will live in the hearts and minds of its students and parents for many generations, if it is anything like its sister schools around the world.

### *The International Charter School of Schenectady – New York*



*The International Charter School of Schenectady, NY (ICSS)* is a tuition-free public school with a college-preparatory curriculum. The charter school opened in September 2002 to serve the NY community. Charter schools are funded with tax money but are privately run. *ICSS's* mission is to deliver an international-style curriculum to a diverse school population and equip them with essential skills and understanding to be able to cope with the challenges of the world. This year, the K-4 charter school also provides a structured peer tutoring environment with weekly progress tests.

Though only in its first year, the SLO program at *ICSS* is full of vitality and rich in activity and growth. ### Academics



SABIS® maintains an excellent reputation for delivering academic results which will enhance the school’s chances of recruiting and hiring experienced staff.

As part of its successful educational program, SABIS® excels in utilizing external as well as internal measurements that ensure student accountability for overall school performance through its SABIS Academic Monitoring System (SABIS AMS™). The tests administered are in accordance with state guidelines for each grade level tested.



In the enrollment lottery held in March, the school had no more available places for next fall and waiting lists were already filled with names of students eager to enroll. “We’re very happy to see the confidence this shows in our school,” said Lilian Turner, director of the charter school. “We want a school that is recognized as providing an excellent education, and this is that recognition.” While SABIS® is responsible for the day-to-day school management, parents’ involvement in the school community is high, showing that education is a top priority for their children. This clearly shows that parents are fully satisfied with the school’s educational program and the academic performance of their children.

One recent newspaper article stated that “...of 265 students enrolled this year, 256 will return to the charter school next year, a 97% retention rate...There were as many as 111 spaces for Kindergarten children and as few as six in the fourth grade”. The school will enroll 425 students next year and will also expand to offer the fifth grade. With this expansion in mind, *ICSS* will have room for 169 new students. One grade will be added each year until the school becomes a K-12 school.

At *ICSS*, the curriculum allows learning to be fun for the students; this generates enthusiasm and creates a positive learning environment.

The school will seek to produce world-class citizens with a desire for life-long learning. It will prepare its students for success in college and beyond based on the SABIS® Educational System, a proven college-preparatory program aligned with the state and ensuring instructors to teach essential skills required for academic success. 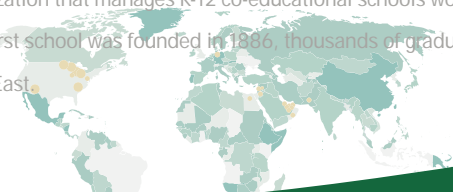
